Both teams left early on Tuesday morning and returned late Friday night. The Novice Parliamentary Procedure Team competed on Wednesday and Thursday. They advanced to the semi-finals because they placed top 10 in the nation. They were very close to placing within the top 4 but were defeated by a small margin. We are extremely proud of them for receiving a gold rating. The Meats Evaluation Team placed 22nd out of 43 teams in the Nation. This placing earned them a silver rating. 
